

### Develop your creativity:

- ◆ Can you make a sock or glove puppet?

### Extend your research skills:

- ◆ Research the toys that your parents or grandparents played with. What questions would you want to ask? What did you find out?
- ◆ What were toys like for children in Victorian times? What would be inside a Victorian toy shop window?
- ◆ Choose a toy e.g. a doll or train set. Compare how the toy has changed since Victorian times. Is it still made of the same materials? Do the same age children still play with it?

### Explore your mathematical and scientific skills:

- ◆ Can you write a list of the things you need for a picnic with your favourite toy? Can you design a picnic blanket to take on your picnic?
- ◆ Look in a toy shop or toy shop website, what toys can you find that cost less than £10? Choose 2 toys, how much would it cost to buy them?
- ◆ Why are different toys made from different materials? Design a new toy and label the materials
